Listen: your are your most important musical instrument!
3 T's: in, on, with good
100% rule: own space, not someone else's space.
Sonic Spectrum: humans can hear from around 20 Hz up to almost 20,000 Hz. Pay attention to the spot your instrument occupies in the sonic spectrum so you don't compete with another instrument. When everyone owns their space, everyone is heard.
Dynamics make music
Become an arranger. Change something every 4 to 8 measures.
Big Idea: Moment - Clear transition - New Moment (distinct from the previous moment)
You want variety, between songs and moments.
Interesting song layout: of moments is key.
Utilize the dynamic range with the instruments you have.
